

Monday 12th October

Today we will be using our Picture News resources to explore what we can do to look after our world.



Please discuss the question in the box with your child. Use the vocabulary listed to support their language development. If your child does not know the meaning of a word, please explain it to them and revisit it throughout the week.

Speaking and Listening

EYFS Framework: Children are confident to speak in a familiar group. They show care and concern for living things and the environment.

Look at the Picture News poster: What can you see? Have you seen this man before? Does anyone know his name? Tell the children this man is called Sir David Attenborough. He is well known for knowing lots and lots about nature and has made TV programmes and films to tell people facts about our world.

Think about: What does the word nature mean?

Discuss examples of nature such as trees, forests, mountains, the weather, birds and animals etc.

Sir David has been in the news because he has recently joined the social media site, Instagram, to tell everyone he is worried about our world and he wants all young people to help.

Think about: What sort of thing do you think Sir David will be worried about?

Discuss some of the bad things happening in our world e.g. litter getting into our oceans, the icebergs melting in the Arctic, forests being cut down etc.

Question: How can we all help to look after our world?

Sir David is wanting all young people to help look after the world.

Look at the **EY Resource**, which tells us some of the things we can do to help look after the world.

Think about: Which do you do? Can you think of anything else you do to help? Are there any that you think you could do that you don't do at the moment?

Discuss that if one person did all these things it wouldn't make much of a difference, but if all of us do as much as we

can, we can make the world a better place.
