PE and Sports Premium – Moor Nook Primary School (2021-2022)

Background to PE and Sports Premium

The government has provided additional funding of £150 million per annum to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport – has been allocated to primary school head teachers. This funding is ring-fenced and is only for children in Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools

Moor Nook Primary School received £17,740 for the PE and Sports Premium Funding in 2021-2022. At the beginning of 2021 we had £30,487 (some carried over from 2020-2021, this was allowed due to COVID-19 closures) to spend on improving the quality and provision of PE and school sport. The £30,487 must be spent and reported by 31st July 2022.

What does Moor Nook Primary spend the money on?

- buying into services provided by Teamtheme for CPD and to provide extracurricular clubs
- continuing to provide professional development opportunities for staff from Nursery to Year 6
- Ensure that EYFS staff are upskilled to support and provide opportunities for children to develop their FMS
- Introduce Nursery to weekly PE sessions
- Resources EYFS/ KS1 to ensure opportunities to develop and practise skills within continuous provision
- providing specialist PE teachers and qualified sports coaches to work with teachers when teaching PE
- Updating the PE curriculum
- paying for specialist coaches to deliver extra-curricular clubs
- purchasing new equipment and resources
- map the school out for orienteering

Impact from 2021-2022 PE, Sports Premium Funding

- All children received 2 hours of weekly PE
- Teachers upskilled to teach the Lancashire PE planning in line with school curriculum
- swimming and water safety are that by the end of key stage 2 pupils should be taught to:
 - swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres
 - use a range of strokes effectively, for example, front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke
 - perform a safe self-rescue in different water-based situations
 - Overall 73% of children left Key Stage 2 able to swim 25 metres confidently.
 - 60% of the current Year 6 cohort perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations
