

PE and Sports Premium – Moor Nook Primary School

(2020-2021)

Background to PE and Sports Premium

The government has provided additional funding of £150 million per annum to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport – has been allocated to primary school head teachers. This funding is ring-fenced and is only for children in Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools

As a school, we received **£17,670** to spend on improving the quality and provision of PE and school sport.

What does Moor Nook Primary spend the money on?

- buying into services provided by Teamtheme for CPD and to provide extracurricular clubs
- continuing to provide professional development opportunities for staff from Nursery to Year 6
- Ensure that EYFS staff are upskilled to support and provide opportunities for children to develop their FMS
- Introduce Nursery to weekly PE sessions
- Resources EYFS/ KS1 to ensure opportunities to develop and practise skills within continuous provision
- providing specialist PE teachers and qualified sports coaches to work with teachers when teaching PE
- Updating the PE curriculum
- paying for specialist coaches to deliver extra-curricular clubs
- purchasing new equipment and resources
- map the school out for orienteering

Impact from 2019-2020 PE, Sports Premium Funding

- All children received 2 hours of weekly PE
- Teachers upskilled to teach the Lancashire PE planning in line with school curriculum
- swimming and water safety are that by the end of key stage 2 pupils should be taught to:
 - swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres
 - use a range of strokes effectively, for example, front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke
 - perform a safe self-rescue in different water-based situations
 - 83% of Key Stage 2 pupils could swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres
 - 17% of pupils attended catch up swim sessions and a further 7% (2 children) successfully could swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres
 - Overall 90% of children left Key Stage 2 able to swim 25 metres confidently.

Achievements this academic year

- All staff teaching their own PE lessons
- Every child accessing 2 hours PE on a weekly basis
- School PE kit provided and regularly maintained to enable all children to access PE
- New equipment to enable a focus on delivering high quality FMS from nursery onwards
- CPD training to EYFS staff to upskill staff on FMS development and theory
- CPD training delivered to all staff (at Brockholes Primary School) on the KS2 scheme of work
- A new, inspiring and progressive curriculum focusing on skills and knowledge whilst providing opportunities for character building.
- Joined the Boys, Girls Football Leagues and the Netball Leagues
- KS1 children participated in a mulitskills competition
- In 2019-2020 there has been a focus on securing staff's knowledge and understanding of how to develop and promote children's fundamental movement skills. EYFS now provide FMS stations within their continuous provision and staff are trained to support children develop in the five FMS.

New initiatives for this academic year

- Regular intra-school competitions, giving more children the chance to play competitive sport
- Pupils in Year 5 will start to go swimming (January 2019 onwards) to ensure all children meet the 25metres swimming expectation before they leave Year 6
- Regularly monitor staff delivering PE
- CPD Twilight- KS2 app training- curriculum and assessment

Teamtheme

- Our membership with Teamtheme is vital and allows us to enhance the opportunities available for all the children at Moor Nook Primary School to participate in regular physical activity.
- Teamtheme provide CPD for new staff and staff returning from maternity leave
- Teamtheme provide intervention of FMS for KS1 and some KS2 children (Once permitted due to COVID regulations)

Focus for the future

- Work to achieve the Sainsbury's School Games 'Bronze' kitemark
- Continue to provide further opportunities for children to participate in regular competitive sport within school
- Upskill teachers returning from Maternity leave and new staff within school/ new year groups
